

Georgia Tech Students Can Tutor at Two Local Schools

Georgia Tech has partnered with Centennial Place Elementary School in a variety of ways since its inception in 1998. Tech has also partnered with Bethune Elementary School over the years, and both schools are attended by children living in communities that border campus.

This year the principals of both schools have requested math-tutoring assistance from Georgia Tech, based on the prior success of our college students tutoring in years past.

At **Centennial Place** a tutor can pair up with an elementary student during school hours and after school on homework and extra practice problems. At **Bethune** tutors would provide individual and small group instruction and support for grades 3, 4 and 5 during the following time slots:

3rd Grade: 10–11:30 am
4th Grade: 12:30–1:45 pm
5th Grade: 11 am–12:15 pm
